<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>` Weekly speech and language groups for selected children in years one to three (including staff training) and additional reading support</li> <li>` Weekly EYSP project for Reception and Year 1</li> <li>` 1<sup>st</sup> Class Maths and Numbers Count training and implementation</li> <li>` PSA employed to monitor attendance / punctuality and liaise with/support parents</li> <li>` Support teacher in each year group to monitor progress, run focus groups in literacy and maths and provide time for teachers give effective feedback</li> <li>` Learning mentor for Year 6</li> <li>` Edmonton Schools Partnership SLA &amp; subsidised activities</li> </ul>
Impact of spending 2012 - 2013
<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Attendance – initial analysis shows improved attendance for FSM pupils which is above national average</li> <li>2. Some trips and visitors were subsidised enabling all FSM children to benefit from and enjoy experiences they may not have had.</li> <li>3. Speech and language groups raised children's confidence, developed their speaking skills and enabled them to contribute more in class.</li> <li>4. Children receiving learning mentor support or intervention with literacy or maths achieved well</li> <li>5. Phonics results will be known shortly (in 2012 FSM pupils attained above non-FSM pupils)</li> <li>6. In Year 2, FSM children attained above non-FSM and this was considerably better than nationally.</li> <li>7. In Year 6, FSM children attained better than FSM nationally and similar to school non-FSM children. Progress compared well to non-FSM children</li> <li>8. Across the school FSM children are achieving well</li> </ol>
