Nature of expenditure in 2013-14

- `Weekly speech and language groups for selected children in years one to three and additional reading support
- `Weekly EYSI project for Reception and Year 1
- `1st Class Maths and Numbers Count training and implementation
- `PSA employed to monitor attendance / punctuality and liaise with/support parents
- `Support teacher in each year group to monitor progress, run focus groups in literacy and maths and provide additional time for effective feedback
- Learning mentors x 2 part time
- `Edmonton Schools Partnership SLA & subsidised activities
- `Increased translation provision and support for parents
- `Graduate Teaching Assistants employed to provide targeted support
- `Easter holiday study support

Impact of spending 2013-14

- 1. Attendance: school's data shows attendance has improved and is above national average, although slightly below the school's overall average.
- 2. Some trips and visitors were subsidised enabling all children to benefit from and enjoy experiences they may not have had.
- 3. Speech and language groups: these raised children's confidence, developed their speaking skills and enabled them to contribute more in class. They also made good to outstanding progress in reading, writing and maths.
- 4. Early Years Social Inclusion groups: children's social skills improved and they made good to outstanding progress in reading, writing, maths and speaking and listening.
- 5. Children receiving learning mentor support achieved well and all made considerable progress with their social skills.
- 6. Progress is broadly similar for children eligible for Pupil Premium funding and those not, across all year groups and all subjects

- 7. Phonics: 74% of eligible children passed the phonics test in Year 1, which is slightly below those not eligible but is above the national average for 2013.
- 8. KS2: Pupils eligible for Pupil Premium attained below those not eligible, although they attained higher than those eligible nationally.
