Impact / successes for 2017-18

PP children exceeded non PP children in Year 1 phonics test.

The gap between PP and non PP children in EYFS has reduced (2% in 2018 GLD)

PP children access music and other clubs (Autumn 2018 1/3 of PP children attend at least one after school club) In reading progress was good / accelerated in all year groups and in some year groups was above others. Year 2 cohort made accelerated progress in all subjects since the end of Reception

Accelerated / good progress in reading and writing in nearly all year groups since previous key stage, except Year 5

Learning mentor and other staff supported Year 6 pupils to develop resilience and manage emotional difficulties

Attainment in maths in all year groups is below others, despite accelerated progress / increasing number attaining ARE+

Percentage of PP achieving exceeding is considerably lower in all subjects and all cohorts, except Yr1 reading and writing and Yr4 writing.
