This will be your opportunity to find out how the programme will operate and ask any questions you may have.

For years we have been concerned about the safety of our pupils whilst walking down Tile Kiln Lane and many of you have spoken to me about this over the last year. I am now able to inform you that we have been selected to be part of a London wide initiative. The London Borough of Enfield is launching a *School Streets* programme to contribute to a safer and greener borough.

Tile Kiln Lane is soon to become a 'School Street'. This is when is when the roads immediately surrounding a school are closed to motor traffic. For us this will be Tile Kiln Lane. This will operate Monday to Friday in term time, during set times at drop -off and pick-up.

We are working with the local council and an organisation called Sustrans to implement this and they have arranged a number of events and meetings over the next few weeks
